MAY DAY REPORTS

Boston, MA: For the third consecutive year, May Day 2008 in Boston mixed anti-capitalist militancy with celebration and unity for a day of protest that is becoming a tradition. Throughout the year the Boston Socialist Party has been breaking down sectarian barriers on the anti-capitalist left by building working relationships with both anarchists and Trotskyists. For May Day we joined the Industrial Workers of the World and the Northeast Anarchist Network in a spirited feeder march from Kenmore Square to the Boston Common, singing traditional labor songs and waving a mix of red and black flags. On the Boston Common we joined with a broader range of radicals and progressives brought together by the Boston May Day Coalition. Solidarity with immigrant workers and the global south headlined the rally's message. Then we marched and rallied again at Copley Square as has become the tradition for May Day. Our own Chris Persampieri drew applause from the crowd by calling for immigrant rights, union organizing, and left unity. Afterwards, our red and black block regrouped one more time for a spontaneous march through the bourgeois playground known as Newbury Street.

New York, NY: The NYC Local took part in a lively celebration of May Day. We participated in a side mobilization organized primarily by the Chinese Staff Workers Association as part of the Break the Chains Coalition. The main demand was for an end to employer sanctions laws (Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986) which are used by the Immigration police and the bosses as a pretext for enforcing workplace discipline through raids. More than 1,000 people took part in this rally with speeches translated into Chinese, English and Spanish.

We the marched up to Union Square (14th street), past our national office where War Resisters League Staff prepared a banner with the inscription "No War." I have to admit though, that there were many incredulous passers-by who asked what we were marching for and upon being greeted with "Happy May Day" had no idea what I was talking about. Regardless of historical amnesia they could not help but recognize that workers who are mostly socially invisible on a daily basis were now quite vocal and present.

We arrived at Union Square and joined several other feeder marches. Most immigrant rights groups participated as well as all sectors of the left. Many people spoke excitedly about the shut down of the ports on the West Coast. One highlight was meeting up again with Victor Toro. In the late 60s and 70s Victor was a militant in the MIR in Chile and a leader of shanty-town communities around Santiago. After the government of Salvador Allende was overthrown, Victor was jailed and then forced into exile. He is currently fighting deportation charges.

We ended the night with a showing of the documentary "Wobblies." We had about 20 people turn up at the movie and, even after a long day of marching, the conversation was quite lively.

Northern NJ: Northern New Jersey members joined the NYC Local on May 1st for the New York City May Day march and rally.

On May 3rd, the Local helped organized an immigrant rights action in Bergenfield, NJ where immigrant workers gather and where local "minutemen" protest. The Local is helping hold regular actions at this location.
