

International Women's Day 2012 A Day of Empowerment, Resistance, Celebration



About IWD History... 1909: The Woman's National Committee of the Socialist Party calls for a national day of protest on the last Sunday of February to support women's suffrage in the context of the

broader movement for women's rights, workers' rights, and social justice.

1910: The Women's Congress of the Socialist International meets in August in Copenhagen and approves the call for an international day of protest. The specific date is left open to the participants in each country.

1913: Russian socialists begin celebrating International Women's Day. Their intention is to organize rallies for the same day as that set in the United States, but since the Julian calendar lags several days behind the Western calendar, the events take place in early March by our reckoning.

1917: The date of March 8 for International Women's Day gets established when tens of thousands of women, demonstrating on that day in Petrograd, the capital of Russia, spark a revolution that topples three centuries of czarist autocracy.

About IWD and Peace....

In August 1914, World War I erupted, leading to the slaughter of millions. International Women's Day became a focal point for those calling for an immediate end to the war. On February 23, 1917, (March 8 on the new calendar), tens of thousands of Russian women celebrated International Women's Day by surging onto the streets of Petrograd demanding peace. These militant protests led to the downfall of the czar and, soon afterward, Russia's decision to leave the war.

Senseless war continues. Once again we are told that military action in Iraq and Afghanistan is intended to promote freedom and peace, and once again we know the real reasons are about power and wealth. As we demonstrate our opposition to war and occupation this and every International Women's Day, we commemorate the heroic actions of the women in Petrograd in 1917 and the women in Tehran in 1979. In doing so, we maintain an unbroken link in the struggle for peace, justice, and equality.

SPUSA National Committee Meets In Dallas

On the weekend of January 28-29th, the Party's National Committee met in Dallas Texas. The Committee elected new officers; Stephanie Gussin was elected as the new vice-chair and Kristin Schall was elected as the new Editor of The Socialist. The NC also rechartered the Party's Women's Commission and filled the spring and summer calendar with a series of campaigns and mobilizations.

- On March 8th Locals will kick off spring activist work with International Women's Day actions. *The Socialist* has put out a special International Women's Day issue and IWD actions will be posted online at: www.socialistpartyusa.org/iwd2012.html
- On March 16-18th the Party will take part in the Left Forum in New York City. We'll be tabling and taking part in workshops including one featuring SPUSA presidential candidate Stewart Alexander. (www.leftforum.org)
- On March 23 25th the Party will take part in the United National Anti-War Committee's National Conference in Stamford Connecticut. We'll be there as part of our affiliation with UNAC and hoping to build the anti-war movement.
- In April we'll be organizing for May Day actions and the G-8 demos in May. On May Day we'll be coordinating local actions across the U.S. May Day is the historic kick off to our Socialist Summer campaign, but this year we'll be organizing a second action in May before Socialist Summer gening. The Party will organizing a contingent at the G-8 demonstration in Chicago on May 19-20th. May Day and G-8 info out to members and on-line in early April.
- Socialist Summer will start immediately after the G-8 demos. The campaign will consist of two parts, the first is the three activist campaigns; "Occupy Wall St", Electoral Action/Ballot Access and Youth Organizing. The second part being our National Organizing Conference on July 28-29th in Memphis Tennessee.

While all this is happening, the Party's electoral campaigns have started with a bang. The Alexander/Mendoza campaign has already hit the radio and web with interviews and video promotions. You can get updates on the Party's presidential slate at: www.stewartalexanderforpresident2012.org
